Dear parents/caregivers

Haere mai and welcome to the 2023 school year!

The Year of the Rabbit has certainly started in the most unpredictable way. Thank you all for being so respectful of our enforced closure and restrictions over the last week as we know the very short notice caused significant inconvenience, not helped by some very confusing Ministry of Education and media communications. With water damage to the grounds and leaks, it was essential that our rooms were dry and odour free before we could fully re-open.

It was wonderful to see all of our families back to school and welcome our 65+ new families at Wednesday's powhiri welcome assembly. We also welcomed new teaching staff; Jae Kim and Emily McGall (see introductions over) and returning teachers; Deli Franklin, Kirsty Hodd, Shawnee Marcroft and Sarah Summers. We were also delighted to welcome our Mandarin Language Assistant, Fen Guo to our school and New Zealand (more information to follow).

School statements have now been issued to all families. These invoices cover both donation and required payments. Mathletics/Math Seeds subscriptions expire at the end of February, so if possible please make this payment early or as soon as possible to allow your child access to this home learning programme. We absolutely understand that given the pressure on family incomes—uniform, stationery, higher cost of living, plus possible flood damage causing additional pressure, that full payments may not be able to made this month. If your school donation portion (as identified on your statement) is paid by 31st March then you can claim a portion back through Inland Revenue.

At this start of year we have many new parents (and some who have **simply forgotten** our road safety procedures). Every day our staff (and road patrol parent volunteers) are constantly reminding parents of our front gate and pedestrian crossing rules. This situation is only going to get busier when the construction site is fully operating in March. The school (as do any citizens) have the right to photograph and email ANY illegal parking or illegal child drop offs, and report the offence to NZ police. This is not a situation I want my staff to be faced with, however we hold the child's safety as paramount. We also cannot do anything once a traffic offence and fine notice been issued.

The same rules apply to everyone—there are NO exceptions no matter how late you may be for work or what your circumstances are. So a few brief reminders again:

- There is NO parking in the bus bay (this is simply a drop off zone only) and NO Entry when buses are due, loading or dropping off.
- This morning the road patrol team notified me that two families had their children get out of the car whilst waiting in the queue on Bass Road. Absolutely unacceptable. Please do not do this, as if the traffic had started moving again we could have had a casualty.
- All parents please note that the back entrance to the school from Roanoke Way is not open for cars (except for a few allocated staff). When you are dropping off or picking up children from school or Kelly Club at the back entrance, you must park on the road on Roanoke Way and walk your child into school.
