Dear parents/caregivers

This week we enrolled our 100th new starter to Albany Primary School for 2023! In 2021 this milestone occurred on 17th May and in 2022 on 9th May. This roll growth is what was "our "normal pre-COVID and in many ways the slower growth has been an advantage to ensure we had enough temporary classrooms on site. The growth this year was an indication of our post COVID status and reopening of borders and visa applications.

Congratulations to our **fantastic swimming team** who at last Friday's Interschool swimming tournament were awarded the Fairplay trophy acknowledging our students exceptional sense of sportsmanship and fairplay. As one very proud student commented to me, as they shared the trophy, "we didn't only cheer for our school team, we cheered for all of the teams."

Thanks to the Junior Teaching Team for sharing a highly informative meeting and workshops on Tuesday evening, explaining the new **Better Start Literacy Approach.** We know some parents would have loved to attend but were not able to, so we will be sharing information about the approach on our website in the future. From next week the construction company will be **moving our current Bus Shelter and footpath entry** to the **opposite side of the bus bay.** Whilst both our school and the construction team will do our very best to ensure both traffic and pedestrian flow is safe, please "**expect the unexpected**" and watch and guide your children where to walk, as the normal paths will be removed. Road cones and safety barriers will direct you where to walk, and safety fencing will be placed around all no entry areas, with no access through the staff carpark. The bulk of the work will be completed during the holidays.

Parents and Mr Mike are still reporting daily the total disregard some people have for **road rules**, in particular parking on yellow dotted (no parking) lines, or dropping children at the pedestrian crossing or Albany Highway. Instead we urge you to drop your children further down Bass Road, a safe walk of two - three minutes. If everyone adopted these actions we would have improved traffic flow and hopefully reduce the road rage. We issue these notices BECAUSE WE CARE ABOUT THE SAFETY OF EVERY CHILD. If you see anyone blatantly or repeatedly disregarding school or traffic rules, any citizen has the right to send information to Community Roadwatch | New Zealand Police - online form.

From 2nd March, Auckland Transport **reduced the speed** in the following roads around the school to 30km/hour: Bass Road, Crewe Close, Cuthill Close, Harkin Close, Kinleith Way, Mahoney Drive, Roanoke Way, Sample Road, Summerfield Lane, Vinewood Drive. Please adjust your speed accordingly.
