Dear parents/caregivers

There was huge excitement in our school this morning, as mysteriously **Easter Bunny footprints** were clearly visible all across the court leading to the school field. The Year One learners (and their parents) had made a huge effort to design and produce some exceptional hats to celebrate this special long weekend.

With Easter leading into the holidays the start of our Term 2 is unusual in that **Monday 24th April** is our Kahui Ako conference day for staff (therefore school will be closed to students). This is a day when our seven local schools come together at Albany Senior High School for professional learning. Much of our focus this year will be around the changes to the New Zealand curriculum as the New Zealand History focus is also relevant for Junior and Senior High teachers.

ANZAC (Australian and New Zealand Army Corps) Day is a **public holiday held on 25th April.** The Albany community have strong links to this part of our local history, as at the time of the World War I, the loss of life from such a small village had significant impact on families (see the mural near our flagpole). Some of these young soldiers had actually attended Albany Primary School. There is a commemoration ceremony held at the Coronation Hall (corner of Library Lane and Albany Highway), to which all families are welcome. (See invitation overleaf.)

Thank you all for showing the school value of Respect with the significant disruption to pedestrian traffic at the front gate entry area. During the holidays **the bus shelter will be relocated** and the new kindy footpath completed. This is in readiness for the closure of the current footpath, as this will be completely boarded up to allow the construction site vehicles their own driveway entry.

**Have a wonderful and safe break**. Whatever your faith may this Easter time be one of gratitude and reflection for your family and whānau. With the break from normal school routines may you all have time to enjoy nature and family time together.
