
You may be aware that Albany Senior High School has had to close for 4th and 5th May due to an identified case of **measles**. This is a timely reminder of the seriousness and highly contagious nature of this disease. To ensure that our student information system is up to date in this regard please check your child's immunity by either calling your child's GP or checking their Well Child/Tamarki Ora book. If your child does not have evidence of two MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella vaccination doses after 12 months of age) please inform the school office. We will also send letters home to parents of students that we do not have immunisation records for, and for students that we have been previously advised that are not fully immunised/unimmunised. If you receive a letter in this regard, please respond to the school office so that we have the most up to date information available as we will follow any Auckland Regional Public Health Service (Te Whatu Ora) requirements should we be informed of any positive cases of measles affecting our school community.

Term 2 is packed with exciting learning opportunities planned for both in and out of the classroom. The term includes our Year 5/6 team attending camps at Carey Park, Book Week (further details to come), Student Led Conferences taking place later in the term, plus many other events and activities planned for teams/clubs as well as the commencement of winter after school sports.
