Dear parents/caregivers

Our ground-breaking ceremony took place on the wet morning of Tuesday 9th May (little did we know what was yet to come). In attendance were members of our kapa haka group, senior leadership team, representatives of our Board and Friends of the School, Ministry of Education, Site Manager and Project management team. Helen Furness kindly represented the staff as the longest serving teacher and leader present. The kapa haka representatives were magnificent and the beauty of their waiata, plus Ian Thompson's karakia and Rick Pierce's blessing made the weather seem insignificant. The kapa haka's performance was a tribute to their hard work and practice; this feedback was emailed to me by Olga Lozova, Delivery Manager with Ministry of Education "*Thank you for the amazing ground-breaking ceremony earlier this morning. Many thanks for the calm and orderly manner in which parents responded to our invitation to collect children on the afternoon of the 9th May. We had over 375 students signed out within a 3 hour period. Following feedback we will work to refine this emergency sign out system.

Thanks to all the staff and parents of students in Areas 24, 25 and 26 involved in the fantastic **Year 5/6 camp** at Carey Park, Henderson Valley. We wish dry weather and sunshine for Areas 28, 29 and 31 for their camp next week.

We warmly welcome **Danbee Kim (Area 18)** who has been appointed to start our next new entrant class. We wish Erin Konings (Area 8) all the very best for her maternity leave and welcome Makayla Lawson to the class.

Now that the full blast of winter weather has hit us, and the fact that we have limited court and a very muddy field space we request ALL students bring a change of clothes in their school bag. This does not have to be school uniform. This will prevent parents and caregivers being called into the school by the office to provide spare clothes so that your child doesn't have to sit in class in wet or muddy clothes for the day.

The winter weather also seems to have bought out the "worst" in parent driving behaviour. It is so disappointing that instead of sharing the wonderful creative learning that is occurring in our school, half of my newsletter today is about road safety rules. On a daily basis our road patrol students, parents and staff observe and report dangerous driving behaviour. A HUGE thanks to the 99% of parents who do follow our road rules, and who also attempt to politely help or show new parents or visitors when they make a mistake, as we know it is not easy when you have not driven near the school entries in peak traffic times. We have these rules because we care about our children's safety.

"No Entry" times to the bus bay require you to continue down Bass Rd and turn around at the roundabout. There is a sign that indicates when the "NO RIGHT HAND TURN" into the bus bay applies, as the time for this does vary each day depending on when our three school buses arrive, as well as traffic flow. We have very clear rules around times that the no right hand rule into the bus bay applies (and a huge thank you to the 99% of parents who do respect this rule).

We had a near miss reported when a child was almost hit by a car at the school rear entry– caused because several cars had parked on the yellow dotted NO PARKING lines in Roanoke Way. The yellow dotted lines are marked there to allow our children visibility past the cars when crossing the road. Auckland Transport will be issuing tickets if any cars stop or park on these marked areas.

It is noted that parents are reversing into angle parking on Bass Road, which is illegal. We have had it confirmed by the NZ Police that if angle parking is indicated then a driver must not stand or park a vehicle otherwise than in accordance with the direction indicated. In essence you must be facing the same direction as the flow of traffic. Reversing into an angle park means you will disrupt traffic in both directions to manoeuvre in successfully and disrupt traffic in both directions to get out. Section 40 of the Land Transport Act 1998 and Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004, Section 6.13 apply.. Please note that you can get a \$40 fine for this incorrect parking.




