
















- The overall relationship between attendance and attainment can be best described by a straight line, especially at attendance rates over about 70 percent.
- The first 1.5 days of justified absence across Term 2 is the only 'safe' level of nonattendance (where there is a minimal impact on a student's attainment) we could find evidence for.
- This implies that any other absence from school is associated with substantially lower attainment – that is, every day matters.
- The first few unjustified absences in a term are associated with the largest drops in attainment.

Albany Primary Attendance T1 2023

90 - 100%

- * missing **no more than 5 days** in a 10 week term.
- * equates to **20hrs** of learning time.
- * 90% attendance over 5yrs is equivalent to missing TWO TERMS of absence

80% - 90%

- * missing between 5 and 10 days per term.
- * equates to missing one day per week per term (40hrs)
- * 80% attendance over 5yrs is equivalent to missing a FULL SCHOOL YEAR

70% - 80%

- * missing between 10 and 15 days per term.
- * equates to missing the equivalent of 1.5 days per week per term (60hrs)
- * 70% attendance over 5yrs is equivalent to missing 1.5 YEARS OF SCHOOL

Below 70%

- * missing greater than 15 days per term
- * equates to missing the more than 1.5 days per week per term (60hrs)
- * Below 70% over 5yrs is equivalent to missing over 1.5 YEARS OF SCHOOL

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Looking at the chart above—a child whose attendance is 90-100% over 5 years is still mequivalent to missing two terms of school.

You may be aware (through significant media coverage) the national concern regarding the declining rates of student attendance in schools. Regular attendance at school is critical for our children's learning, wellbeing and their future. Not only are children missing out on important learning they need, but on friendship, connections, and fun moments. We know that with the disruptions this year this has had a direct impact on our students learning time so going forward every day counts.

It is our role as teachers together with you as whānau (family) to ensure that attendance every day at school does matter, and we need your support to ensure that we are committed to this goal together. If the value of attendance is not prioritised at primary school level patterns of truancy can then become established in our older children. You may already have had a call from our staff to enquire why your child is absent. The school are then required to share this information with the Ministry of Education as this information is being tracked carefully to ensure that your child does attend school every day. On occasions, the school is required to contact external Attendance Services whose independent role is to support your child to attend school consistently. Please advise us if you have any questions or concerns regarding your child's attendance at school so we can support in any way to help you make every moment of learning time matter for your child. 
School closes at the usual time of 2.55pm
