TRAFFIC SAFETY NOTICES

DO NOT STOP ALONG ALBANY HIGHWAY TO LET YOUR CHILDREN OUT OF THE CAR

We have been advised of students getting out of cars along Albany Highway. A reminder to all parents - please do not allow your child to exit cars along Albany Highway in the traffic queues as road safety is our top priority.

Directly opposite the Bass Road traffic light intersection you may have noticed that the entry road to what was Massey University is currently closed off with both a safety fence and cones.

Therefore you cannot park or drop your children in this zone as this is not a safe place for children to be getting out of vehicles, as you are illegally parking on a pedestrian crossing / intersection. Auckland Traffic (Waka Kotahi) will be issuing tickets in the next few weeks.
