Dear parents/caregivers

What a joy it has been to finally have a few days of sunshine to dry out our grounds so that students can use the field space. Please check that your child has a set of spare clothes in their school bag (this does not have to be uniform) should your child end up with mud all over them and require a change of clothes – this will also avoid a phone call to parents to bring spare clothes to school.

Unfortunately our school has continued to be hit very hard with winter illnesses. Thankyou to all the parents that have left a message on the school absence line or emailed to let us know that your child will be absent, as our admin staff are currently spending at least an hour every morning phoning parents when absences are unexplained. Please remind your child to report to the office if they arrive after the bell, as this will save us calling you, or causing you undue stress if you know you dropped your child to school and your child missed roll call. We have been very fortunate to have every room covered with relievers which has prevented the need to double up classes as some schools have had to do this winter. Some days we have needed a reliever for the reliever as they too have called in sick, so sometimes it has not always been possible to have the same person teaching in the room all week.

Our thanks to Alysa Lee and Cherie Goldie as well as the fantastic parent supporters and enthusiastic students who attended our Trees for Survival planting day. All year this group have been supporting the growth of individual seedlings culminating in the planting of over 500 native trees in Wainui along waterways and erosion prone hillsides. This was an opportunity to make a practical difference to the environment as well as learn about conservation, revegetation, wetland restoration and protecting stream quality.

We are pleased to advise of the following staffing updates—we welcome Terri Cochrane as our new entrant teacher in Area 14, and welcome back Sarah Gartner who will be teaching in Area 8. We welcome Jean Choi (one of our ex students and now a fully qualified teacher) who will be teaching in Area 28 whilst Abi Cawood is on maternity leave.

While the 99% of parents are amazing at following our traffic rules, and we so appreciate your patience and courtesy to each other, we still have few drivers who continue to park on the yellow lines in streets around the school and on Bass Road, OR do a 'U' turn rather than patiently following the flow of traffic down to the roundabout. Auckland Transport are supporting us over the next few weeks to issue tickets (see fine notice attached on page 3), as you are breaking traffic rules and endangering our students through this blatant disregard for their safety.

Safety at the School Gate Park safe





Before and after school is a busy time for everyone. Parking rules help protect our children and keep them safe. Drivers who park illegally put our kids at risk.

This term parking officers will be on patrol outside your school to issue tickets to those who are illegally parked.

Fines for illegal parking include:

| • | Parked on the footpath | \$40 |
|---|--|------|
| • | Parked across or within 1m of a vehicle entrance | \$40 |
| • | Parked within 6m either side of an unmarked bus stop | \$40 |
| • | Parked within a marked bus stop | \$60 |
| • | Parked within 0.5m of a fire hydrant with no one in the car legally capable of moving it | \$60 |
| • | Parked within a designated bus lane, transit or cycle lane | \$60 |
| • | Parked on a clearway | \$60 |
| • | Double parked | \$60 |
| • | Inconsiderate parking to other road users, including pedestrians | \$60 |
| • | Parked on or within 6m of an intersection | \$60 |
| • | Parked on a pedestrian crossing | \$60 |
| • | Parked on a broken vellow line | \$60 |

These parking offences are detailed in the New Zealand Road Code.
