Finally the signals of spring are awakening, the birds are nesting and our days are lengthening. Koanga is the Maori word for spring (September to November). It includes the word 'ko', a digging implement: spring is the time to dig the soil. 'Light spring showers' are known as 'ua kowhai' or 'kowhai showers', referring to the September bloom of yellow flowers on the kōwhai tree.



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This week we have enjoyed celebrating Whānau Week when every afternoon classes work with their Tuakana Taina class to highlight Te Ao Māori myths and legends, visual and performing arts, waiata (music) as well as traditional games and preparing food.

We are looking forward to our Student Led Conferences on Wednesday 13th and Thursday 14th September from 3.30pm. This is a wonderful opportunity to hear from your child about how and what they have been learning this term. Information about Student Led Conferences and instructions on how to make a booking will be communicated this afternoon.

Last night we concluded our series of three parent consultation meetings for our local implementation of the Health Curriculum (Relationship's and Sexuality).
