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TRAFFIC SAFETY CONCERNS

How would you feel if it was your child hit and in hospital simply because you were rushing and didn't follow the road or school parking/drop off rules?

Driver behaviour continues to be the number one issue for our school, as the safety of our children is at risk on a daily basis.

We thank those parents who continue to do the right thing, and have the courage to model great citizenship by politely telling other parents when they are not following the rules. We know that some of this feedback isn't always received in a positive manner but addressing poor driving behaviour is the only way that we can collectively raise our standards.

PLEASE read the information below and simply follow the road rules:

- DO NOT park or drop children off where there are yellow lines marked.
- DO NOT park on the yellow lines on Bass Road by the pedestrian crossing. They are marked to ensure that children can see approaching cars.
- DO NOT park in Aria Gardens carpark.
- DO NOT park in or over residents driveways.
- DO NOT drop your children off while in traffic queues on Albany Highway, or waiting at the pedestrian crossing in Bass Road.

Parents are reporting that parents are telling their children to get out of the car **from the middle lane on Albany Highway whilst waiting at the lights.** This is an accident waiting to happen. All of our students are capable of walking a short distance from the end of Bass Road.

As you will be aware, one of our children was hit by a car reversing our of a driveway last week. As a result, Auckland Transport will complete a review of our school entry points and will issue tickets for illegal and dangerous parking - but rather than punitive action being taken think SAFETY.

With over 740 students arriving and leaving on an daily basis think first before rushing and disregarding road and school parking/drop off rules.

The rules are in place for the safety of our full school community.

SUMMERFIELD LANE—don't park on yellow lines.



ROANOKE WAY—please drive to end of culdesac and turn around rather than using driveways.

The TREEmendous Makeover that created our Native Grove

In 2009 following a submission by Teacher Rosie Ponifasio-Hughes and our Green Grubs Garden Club, Albany Primary School was awarded a \$10,000 Treemendous Makeover to create our Native Grove.

On Saturday 22nd May 2010, our school community turned out with gumboots and spades to make a change! We've all seen those garden makeover shows, and this was just like TV1's "Mucking In"- some 600 native plants, 9 truck loads of top soil and mulch, countless barrow loads of bark loaded and spread, concrete paths and pad laid, not to mention a board walk that grew metre by metre in front of our eyes. The sun added a golden touch to the most fantastic outdoor community working bee ever experienced at Albany Primary School. Major sponsors included Project Crimson, the Mazda Foundation, Mazda NZ and Meridian Energy. Many local businesses supplied materials. Des Ripi our School's Kamatua at the time, flew up from Wellington for the event to bless the work and land. The local Mayor and Deputy Mayor also attended.

Over the subsequent years

On Friday 4th November 2022 we held a further Working Bee to clean up the native grove and plant 250 trees and spread mulch. This was co-ordinated by Aimee Redknap. Assistance was provided by the Green Grubs Gardening Club and teachers, Anna Harrison at Sustainable Schools/Trees for Survival and Nick Maine for donation of trees and Treescape for mulch. Timothy M (student, Albany Senior High School) gave us a lot of expertise with weeding, planting and gave a beautiful Karakia.

What a joy it was and continues to be, playing a part in creating something that will still be a unique feature of this school for future generations to enjoy.
