SCHOOL BUSES—NO LONGER A FREE SERVICE

This information has been emailed to parents of students catching our school buses—if your child catches the school bus and you did not receive the email please contact Jan in the school office (jmunroe@albany.school.nz)

We have received the following advice from Auckland Transport:

Free travel for 5 to 12 year olds and half-price travel for 13 to 24 year olds on AT bus, train and ferry services will end on 30 April 2024, in line with the government's decision to withdraw funding for these concessions.

This means that from Wednesday 1 May:

5 to 12 year olds will no longer travel for free on weekdays and will instead pay a child concession (at least 40% off adult fares). They will continue to travel for free on weekends. The child concession will apply to anyone aged 5 to 15, who has a registered AT HOP card with their correct date of birth.

ANZAC WALL OF REMEMBRANCE


16,697 New Zealanders were killed and 41,317 were wounded during World War I. A further thousand men died within five years of the war's end as a result of injuries sustained, and 507 died while training in New Zealand between 1914 and 1918.

The Fields of Remembrance Trust was established to provide Kiwis with the opportunity to honour those who served their country in World War I, and together with the Ministry of Education formed a partnership to support all schools and kura in commemorating the sacrifice of our veterans in the first modern war; a war that engulfed most of the planet.

In early 2015 each school and kura was given 30 white crosses to commemorate the men and women who died for New Zealand. Each cross was named to include local soldiers and nurses; four New Zealand Victoria Cross recipients; the youngest New Zealander (aged 17); and an All Black captain. One of the crosses was labelled with the words "known unto God" to commemorate the 'unknown soldier'. At Albany Primary School, a memorial with the reminder 'lest we forget' was created on the staffroom wall (facing the courts) to display these crosses.

Albany Memorial Library (corner Library Lane) was built as a standing memorial. The east window of the library commemorates the Great War 1914 to 1918. A brick fireplace inside incorporates a marble memorial tablet which records the names of the 23 local men who gave their lives during the First World War (a total of 77 men from the district volunteered). Another plaque honours seven from the Second World War.

With ANZAC day being commemorated on 25th April, this is a timely reminder to stop and remember the sacrifices made to ensure our way of life in New Zealand.



Why do we wear poppies on ANZAC Day?

Remembrance poppies are produced by veterans' associations, who exchange the poppies for charitable donations used to give financial, social and emotional support to members and veterans of the armed forces. In New Zealand this is through the RSA (Returned Servicemen's Association).

Inspired by the war poem "In Flanders Fields" by Moina Michael, they were first used near the end of World War I.
