Dear parents/caregivers

I hope you enjoyed the long weekend, the celebration of the Queen's 70 year old reign and the weather not as bad as initially predicted.

What a highlight having our Year 3-6 cross country last week, on the most stunning Autumn morning. It was fantastic to see so many parents and whānau supporting our eager runners, who had been training all term. The students' fitness levels increased significantly during this term and it was a celebration of this effort to have all students finish the course. Congratulations to those students that were successfully placed, and will represent our school at the Interschool event. To all students (and the dinosaurs) that finished the course you showed true determination and grit.

Thank you for your continued vigilance in wearing masks on entering school buildings; keeping your children home if they are unwell, and for alerting the school office if your child or family are unwell, isolating or testing positive. A reminder that we are still at orange level and encourage our Year 3-6 students to wear masks. On average we have had very few students confirmed positive on a weekly basis with no evidence of spread within the school. Unfortunately we are experiencing waves of staff absence with approximately one quarter of our staff having been absent due to illness (not all COVID related). We have a fantastic group of relievers but unfortunately many of them are also not available due to winter illness, so at times classes may have had several teachers within a day, as specialist and leadership staff cover blocks. I would like to acknowledge parents for your understanding of this situation at this time and to all staff for their flexibility and support for each other during this time. Let's hope we are almost through the worst...

For those of you that may have been on the school site last week or in the weekend, you will have seen that a start has been made on the demolition of the old Junior Block. Safety fencing has been erected around the site as services are removed. We are aware of breaches to the fencing after school hours and want to reiterate the danger of this and to please keep out. In the next two weeks the hall driveway will be completely closed off as large diggers and trucks will be loading debris. Wherever possible trucks will only enter school grounds outside of school hours but please be aware that there will be disruptions to traffic flow and pedestrian entry areas.
