Dear parents/caregivers

Toku reo, toku ohooho (My language, my awakening)

This week we celebrate both Māori language week as well as our own school Whānau Week. This focus on our unique Māori culture has become an Albany Primary School tradition (starting around 20 years ago). Every afternoon, classes comprising multi year levels meet in their ropū (group) for an interactive afternoon of learning te reo as well as a range of activities that may include waiata (singing), traditional games, arts or traditional crafts, or learning about Māori myths and legends.

At our opening whole school assembly this morning I also recognised with sadness and honour the passing of Queen Elizabeth II through sharing the whakatauki (proverb) above. Such a magnificent leader and sovereign of our commonwealth for over 70 years, whose life dedication to service was exemplary. Our flag will remain at half mast for this period of national mourning. Today cabinet announced the "Queen Elizabeth II Memorial Day" to commemorate the state memorial service on Monday 26th September, with a public holiday to commemorate this event. Therefore school will be closed on this day.

Tomorrow, information will be coming home regarding booking your time for your child's **Student Led Conference on Thursday 22nd September**. This is a valuable opportunity to hear and see your child's learning progress as well as the opportunity to speak with the teacher if you have any questions. School closes at an earlier time of 12.30pm to allow a 25 minute session with families. Unfortunately we were informed today by the bus company that neither the 061 or the 062 buses are able to come at lunch time. Bus parents will receive a separate letter as well as via our school email communications regarding arrangements for these children. If you are a parent of a bus student and do not receive these communications, please contact the school office.

You'll be aware that New Zealand will move to a new, long-term approach to COVID-19. These changes have been made based on public health advice and reflect high levels of immunity and declining case numbers across New Zealand. This new approach will only result in minor changes to the way we operate. The very positive news is that household contacts of a person with COVID-19 do not need to isolate, but instead are asked to complete a RAT test each day, for five days. Therefore, ākonga who are household contacts but test negative and do not have COVID-19 symptoms, should continue to attend. It is the best place for them to be so they can be engaged in their learning, and connected with their teachers, classmates and friends. Information on how to get RAT kits can be found here: Request a RAT—Ministry of Health. Mask wearing is no longer required, however if your family prefer your child to continue wearing a mask this is your choice and also permissible by the school. All the other recommended public health measures will stay in place as we know they reduce the spread of infectious illnesses including COVID-19. These include ensuring our indoor spaces are well-ventilated, maintaining good hand hygiene, encouraging everyone to cough or sneeze into elbows and, most importantly, staying home and getting tested if they have COVID-19 symptoms. Thank you all for your amazing support following the regulations, for these many months, as we know how difficult this was for our learners and staff.

Thanks to Mr James Hopkins (Deputy Principal of Year 3/4) and to the parents that attended his highly informative Curriculum Information Parent Meeting held two weeks ago. Not only was James able to explain our school curriculum but also the changes that are occurring through the new Curriculum Refreshment; including the present changes to Relationships and Sexuality and New Zealand History, with Maths and Literacy to follow. We were the first group that were able to view the amazing resource that he has created—available on our website. If you missed the chance to attend this fantastic opportunity he will be sharing this session again at a 2.15pm on Wednesday 21st September in the staffroom.
