Dear parents/caregivers

It was lovely to **welcome 41 new families** (with students starting during Term 3 to beginning of Term 4) at Tuesday's Pōwhiri Welcome Assembly, as well as welcoming returning staff member Ms Sarah Gartner who is teaching our New Entrant class in Area 34.

Term 4 is always a busy one as teachers are completing assessments, as well as planning all of the exciting end of year activities that come with the final term of the school year. Given so many of these events have not been able to have occurred for the last two years class trips and community events feel extra exciting.

Sadly it is inevitable that at the end of the year we will lose some of our amazing staff; as once again they can travel and teach internationally, move out of Auckland or have family circumstances that require them to leave us. Over the next month (once new staff have been appointed) we begin the process of drafting next year's classes. Our teachers work through a very careful process as they match students who learn well together, teacher styles, multi year level placements and ability levels. End of year dates have now been confirmed, see over. With current COVID level restrictions being removed we are delighted to advise that once again **end of year celebrations will be able to be held on site in our school hall**. You are of course welcome to wear a mask at any school events.

We are looking forward to our upcoming Family Fun Festival and Working Bee on Friday 4th November (with a rainsaver date of Friday 11th November). We have been fortunate enough to have been donated over 200 native plants, thanks to the support from Anna Harrison at Sustainable Schools and Trees for Survival as well as donated and delivered mulch from Treescape. The Green Grub Gardening Club students and teachers (Cherie Goldie, Alysa Lee) have been working hard to clear the Native Grove area of weeds under the guidance of teacher, Aimee Redknap and Timothy M (student, Albany Senior High School). We would love to have as many helpers as possible from 3.30pm—please bring along your gumboots, gardening spades and gloves. We also require a few wheelbarrows to assist with the spreading of mulch—if you are able to provide a wheelbarrow please advise the school office (Jan, phone 09 415 9668, or email jmunroe@albany.school.nz) so we can ensure that we have enough available for use on the evening.

Our FOS team are organising what looks to be an **amazing Family Fun Festival**. It will be a great opportunity for the full school community to get together with your picnics and enjoy a fun filled evening together. There will be games supplied by Auckland Transport and Harcourts, as well as our own 'water balloon toss' and 'tug of war'. As the 4th November is **National Gumboot Day** there will be a special feature 'Gumboot Toss' with optional gold coin donation to the "I am Hope" organisation who offer counselling for young people. 
