

22nd May 2025 Dear parents/caregivers

It was fantastic to have so many parents attend our **cross country** we held yesterday. No puddles or mud (unlike other years) with a golden dry and warm Autumn day. Thank you to Sareta Kemp and staff for arranging the day and training sessions, as well as parent volunteers. Many thanks to Fresh and Save Albany for sponsorship of iceblocks to participating students (further information page 5). Don't forget to present their ad next time you are in the store to receive a 5% discount.

Over the past fortnight we have also held a Board meeting and full school assembly, as well as our safe walking sessions with Community Constable Tania Wansink, Year 5/6 camp parent helpers meeting, Year 1 trip to Howick Historical Village and rippa / tackle rugby festival at Windsor Park. Many thanks to teachers for organising and assisting, and parents for supporting so that these events could proceed.

We have held initial meetings with the Ministry of Education and are delighted to confirm that the contractors and architects have been appointed for **construction of our new gymnasium / hall.** The project is planned to begin in August with a potential opening by next April. While there is still some final internal details to be confirmed, the design is more a gymnasium than our previous hall with a larger floor plan. (See 3D model beside.)



This year we have made a change to the way we select which external charities

and fundraisers we support (hence not participating in Pink Shirt Day last week). To ensure greater understanding and ownership from our learners, the teachers will be talking to the children about a variety of charities, so that together they can select options that may have personal or specific relevance to them. For example one team may be supporting a gold coin donation to a charity such as Starship hospital or SPCA, where another may ask for a pair of pyjamas or a can of food. This charity drive may also be linked to the school wide inquiry concept. Information will be sent to you once the charity, type of support / fundraising and timing is confirmed with the team.

Te Whatu Ora Waitematā provides free **vision and hearing screening** for children at Year levels 0-3 who have not completed their B4 school checks through Plunket. They will be attending school on Friday 13th June, parents of students requiring assessment have been contacted individually for permission. If you have any concerns regarding your child's vision contact Specsavers, and hearing contact Te Whatu Ora Waitematā on phone 09 486 8996 opt 2 ext 43286 (both services are free for primary aged students).

Please note that we have had to change our **Student Led Conference date from Wednesday 25th June to Tuesday 24th June** due to a large number of staff attending Structured Literacy training sessions after school. Student Led Conferences will therefore take place on Tuesday 24th June and Thursday 26th June from 3.30pm. School will close at the usual time on both of these days. Further information including booking details will be sent home a week prior.

This year our **Matariki** celebration will involve an outdoor **whole school assembly at 9.10am on Thursday 19th June** including students displaying learning across all year levels and performances by our kapa haka group. All of our school community is welcome to attend this assembly and celebrate Matariki with us. As with all of our full school assemblies held on the courts, this will be weather dependent.

A reminder that parents are unable to park in the old Massey University entrance at Oaklands Road (currently under construction) the adjacent apartments on Bass Road or Aria gardens carpark. Yellow dotted lines mean **NO STOPPING at all**, regardless of whether you are in the car or not. We have had a number of complaints in this regard, and Auckland Transport

will be ticketing.

Start your day great -



What to expect from our school: You can expect:

- School staff who care about your child, their learning, where they are now, and how to best support them to succeed at school.
- A school whānau that takes all practical steps to make sure your child is at school, and is participating and progressing in their learning.
- A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who you are, where you come from, and what you value.
- Our school is a safe and welcoming place for everyone in our school community. What we expect of parents:

Do your best to help your child attend school every day. This is a legal requirement from the Education and Training Act 2020.

- Contact us if your child is going to be absent and specify the reason (for example if your child will not be at school for a whole day, or part of a day, for an extended period of time, or if they are going to be late).
- Talk with your child about why attending school every day, as well as being on time is important for their learning and their future.
- If your child is reluctant to come to school, talk with them. If something is happening at school that is
 making them want to miss school, talk with us so we can work together.
- Getting back to school quickly after being absent is important. Support your child to return to school as soon as possible. The longer your child is absent from school, the harder it can be to catch up on missed learning. <u>Again, talk with us so we can work together.</u>

Students should be in class by 8:55 a.m. every day. You might think, "It's only 5 minutes."

But here's the impact of all that missed time when we add it up:

5 minutes late every day = 25 minutes every week = 4 hours of missed school every term = 3 full days of school every year. After 10 years, that = 30 days, which is 6 complete weeks of school.One hour of lateness daily = 5 hours of school (the equivalent of a full school day) every week. Over one term this equates to 10 school days (2 weeks) missed. Over a full school year this equates to 8 weeks!
