To Maori the significance of Matariki is a time to spend with whanau, reflect on the past (including ancestors), come together as whanau in the present and look to the future. We will hold an outdoor assembly to celebrate the significance of this mid winter event tomorrow (Thursday 19th), at 9.10am on the outdoor courts, weather permitting. School will be closed on Friday as Matariki (Māori New Year) is a recognised public holiday. We have attached a number of local community Matariki focussed and family events that you may like to attend.

Areas 14,15,and 36 were extremely fortunate to have had the most stunning sunshine for the group attending camp this week. A HUGE thank you to all involved in supporting our Year 5 / 6 children to experience this fantastic Education Outside the Classroom opportunity at Carey Park, Henderson.

I was recently interviewed by a reporter about the value of a written report and I shared the following reflection. Teachers spend many hours writing reports which the Deputy Principals and myself read. We believe the effort to provide you with a detailed record of your child's current progress against the existing Curriculum Levels, with their effort and personal and social competencies is of real value. For many families this written document is proudly shared with extended family or in some situations kept as a reference for posterity. One of our staff members still has her grandfather's school report! Reports will be sent home with your child on Monday.

Your child's report coupled with their Student Led Conference (held next Tuesday and Thursday after school) provide you with the evidence of their learning in the classroom as well as the opportunity to talk to the teacher. As the information sheet that is also enclosed with the report identifies, we are reporting on your child's mid-year level. It is important to recognise that movement across a curriculum

level can take two years. As shared in previous newsletters the curriculum levels are currently under review and we will be consulting with you about future reporting formats once MOE have confirmed requirements. The Ministry of Education's parent information portal has further information in this regard.

After several delays we are very excited to see the start of our sandpit and interactive play space begin to take shape (See photo). Thank you in advance for your support of chocolate sales, as we are hoping to raise enough funds to provide a sunshade over the sandpit.



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As per information in our previous newsletter each team has chosen different charities to support.
