Dear parents/caregivers

Social Media update

We have recently reviewed our school media procedures and would like to ensure that you are informed about the use of social media in our classrooms. At Albany Primary School, we regularly use YouTube, which is considered a form of social media, as part of our teaching and learning programme.

YouTube offers a wide range of engaging and educational content that supports the delivery of the curriculum. Examples include movement breaks from Go Noodle, sing-along videos, and science clips from Mystery Doug.

Your child's safety is our top priority. We have robust internet safety filters in place across all school devices. More importantly, videos are previewed and selected by teachers as part of their lesson planning, ensuring it's not only relevant to learning but also entirely suitable for the age groups it is being shared with.

Lunches

Please do not send boiling water in a thermos to school with your child for noodles at lunch. This is dangerous as other children may run into them or they may burn themselves.

Traffic Concerns

Please be aware that between 8.30am-9.15am, and from 2.30pm-3.15pm (depending on the timing of the school bus arrival and traffic on the Highway) there is a strict **no** right turn into the bus bay. There is a drop down sign (see photo) that the caretaker uses to indicate this requirement. When the no right turn rule applies please understand that we do this to ensure the flow of traffic continues down Bass Road and around the first intersection, so that you may then enter the bus bay safely. We understand this is frustrating at times but this traffic management plan was initiated to ensure the safety of our children is our priority.



We have been informed that a number of parents are parking opposite the traffic lights, by the safety fencing on the old Massey University site. This off road layby is not an approved council parking area, and the school cannot monitor this area, so please consider children's safety carefully as you park and risk potential accident issues at your own peril.

School Uniform

During the process of having school photos taken at the end of last term, we noticed a large number of students who are not wearing correct school uniform. Please note that all students need to be wearing their yellow polo shirt and blue trousers/shorts/skorz/culottes each day accompanied by a school sweatshirt/jacket on cold days.

Parts of our school are still very muddy so please check your child always has a spare set of clothes in their bag, therefore avoiding a phone call from our school office to request you deliver fresh clothes. This spare set is not required to be school uniform.

Given the colder winter temperatures we have added an optional beanie to our school uniform. To ensure consistency and maintain our uniform standards, all beanies must be plain navy blue only, with **no writing**, **logos**, **visible patterns**, **or branding**. As with all uniform items PLEASE ensure label the inside of your child's beanie with their name. We appreciate your cooperation in adhering to these quidelines.
